

Notes to Catalogue 105

This is the second of a series of three catalogues of books ABOUT Churchill which I have produced, based on the new Zoller Bibliography. (n.b.- Signed copies of the Zoller Bibliography available for \$75.00, for details see: http://www.wscbooks.com/Reference_Books.php)

This lists about 170 premium books including rarities, signed copies, review copies, foreign editions, and books in premium condition. There is virtually nothing in here that you could find on the internet. The print is small but you should read the descriptions carefully.

Also available:

Catalogue 106- THE REFERENCE COLLECTION. This lists and illustrates about 700 books, all in the best possible condition, including at least 100 titles never offered anywhere else. This is my reference collection and is the most complete collection anywhere. It is offerred as a lot. But the catalogue provides illustrations of the many of the rarities in Zoller which most collectors have never seen, so is a useful reference on its own. Price \$10.00

How to read the catalogue entries

Each book entry has a catalogue number and title in bold above. There is a picture to the left. The photos on items 1-12 are of the exact books. The photos on items 13-170 are standard images for that title, and may not be the exact book listed. The paragraph on each book gives first the author; then place, publisher, and year. Next is a background on the book, followeed by condition details of this copy. The Zoller reference then appears in brackets (Zxxx). Books from Zoller section A are listed as Zxxx, those from section B as ZBxxx, to avoid confusion with Woods/Lamgworth numbers. The final entry is the price in dollars.




1 Winston Spencer Churchill (signed by Author)

A. MacCallum Scott. Methuen, London, 1905. This is the first biography published on Churchill, when he was a young MP of only 29 years age. A substantial book about the size of Malakand at 5.25 x 7.5 inches, xii + 270 pages and 40 page catalogue at rear, bound in medium blue cloth similar to the familiar Cassell war speech volumes, gilt titles on cover and spine, with 16 illustrations: photos or cartoons. An important book, giving an early view untainted by any knowledge of later greatness. Essential for the Churchill library, but a most uncommon title. This copy tight and unworn, large red stain on front cover, inscribed on free endpaper by Scott and dated 9/2/05. (Z1) \$500.00

Ephesian (C.E.B. Roberts). London, Mills and Boon, 1927. A good full length biography done in the 20's. This first edition is a larger book than later ones at 6 x 9 inches. 272 pages, 11 illustrations. Attractive binding similar to The World Crisis in smooth navy cloth stamped in gilt. Clean bright copy in the scarce original dustwrapper from 1927. The dj is darkened on the spine and worn at edges. (Z11a) \$250.00





This first edition is a larger book than later ones at 6 x 9 inches. 272 pages, 11 illustrations. Attractive binding similar to The World Crisis in smooth navy cloth stamped in gilt. Book is very clean and bright, edges even and white. In correct original dustwrapper, darkened on spine, losses at head of spine to 14 mm deep, front cover of dj creased and torn. (Z11a) \$180.00



3 Winston Churchill in Peace and War

A. MacCallum Scott. London, George Newnes, 1916. An update version of the original by this author from 1905, to include details on the Dardanelles. The penultimate chapter is entitled "The Downfall". Bound in bright red cloth stamped in black, 162 pages, no illustrations Here is a superb copy in the original dustwrapper. Book is tight and unworn. the red cloth shows some faint sunning towards the edges. No inscriptions, foredges even and unspotted. The pictorial dustwrapper is darkened on the spine, and has losses at spine ends, incl a 9 x 15 mm triangle at base. (Z6) \$300.00



8 BATTLE: The Life Story of the Rt. Hon. Winston S. Churchill

Martin, Hugh. London, Sampson, Low, Marston & Co., 1932. The first edition of this title is worth seeking as it is much larger than the wartime reprints and contain material which was later cut. Martin was a journalist who was present at many important events in Churchill's early career, so writes with authority. Usually bound in black, 5.5 x 9 ins, 246 pages, index, 16 illustrations. Here is a copy in the scarce pictorial dustwrapper. Book is crisp and unworn, gilt bright, but there are some areas of the black cloth which have condensation stains. Dustwrapper is bright and attractive, some edge wear and cracks and loss of a 40 x 10 mm piece along top edge of front cover. (Z16) \$200.00



4 The Winstonburg Line

Sitwell, Osbert. London, Hendersons, (1919). A 20 page pamphlet in orange wraps, which publishes 3 highly critical newspapers articles (verses) on Churchill. Caricature on cover and title page. This is Sitwell's first published work, so also in demand from that side. Scarce. Overhanging edges of soft covers are wrinkled as usual. Occasional foxing. (Z8) \$250.00




Winston Churchill and James II of England

Hay, Malcolm V.. London, Harding & More, 1934. A very scarce title, 66 pages, card covers. Primarily a criticism of Churchill's treatment of James II in MARLBOROUGH. This copy one of the scarce blue cloth hardback copies, stamped in blind on front cover, gilt on spine. VG copy, spine a little sunned, contents clean. Laid in is a letter from 1952 when this books sold for six shillings. (Z17) \$250.00


Keynes, John Maynard. London, The Hogarth Press, 1925. In this 32 page pamphlet, the famed economist is highly critical of Churchill's decision to go on the gold standard. This is a triple dip collectible- the subject is Churchill, the author is Keynes, and it was published by the Woolf's Hogarth Press. Scarce, fragile, and important. Bound in pale green wraps. The wraps are unevenly browned towards edges as usual. Spine worn and cracked, but still holding. Owner name on front cover. (Z10) \$200.00

Hay, Malcolm V.. London, Harding & More, 1934. A very scarce title, 66 pages, card covers. Primarily a criticism of Churchill's treatment of James II in MARLBOROUGH. Crisp unworn copy, spine a little darkened. The last one of these I had was from the Cloke collection in 1997. (Z17) \$225.00







Dustwrapper is clipped, clean bright spine, loss of a 15 x 6 mm piece at head of spine. (Z19) \$40.00



Fine crisp copy in unclipped dustwrapper, wear at spine ends, a hole in spine panel, red areas of spine faded. (Z19) \$40.00



There were at least three editions, each of different appearance. This is the third edition, 5.5×8.5 ins, 32 pp, buff wraps with small portrait of Churchill with hat. Faint vertical crease, rubbed at lower corner of front wrap. (Z22) \$250.00



This 6 x 9 inch pamphlet of 36 pages publishes this article which originally appeared in The Canadian Journal of Economics and Political Science. blue card covers. A useful scholarly study, unfortunately it is very scarce. Card covers soiled and edge worn, contents clean. (Z23) \$250.00





Chaplin, E.D.W.. Harrow School, 1941. A very important book, with extensive details on Churchill's days as a Harrow schoolboy. Includes photos of masters and classmates, Churchill's letters to the school paper, etc. This is the deluxe edition bound in real cloth with elaborate gold stamping on spine. This copy is bound in the limited advance issue of smooth blue cloth with elaborate gilt decorations, which is far superior to the normal paper binding. This copy crisp and very bright, some minor condensation marks on covers, frontis plate is loose. Very scarce. (Z37b) \$120.00

Hawthorne, Hildegarde. NY, Appleton-Century, 1942. An illustrated biography of 346 pages written by the granddaughter of Nathaniel Hawthorne. Bound in red cloth blocked gilt. For some reason, this title is incredibly difficult to find, more so than similar works of this era. A very special copy, inscribed by the author to journalist Elizabeth Pennell and with a letter thanking her for the review of the book which ran in the S.F. Chronicle. Also laid in a publishers review slip. Dustwrapper badly worn and ton missing two large pieces. (Z61) \$50.00
