

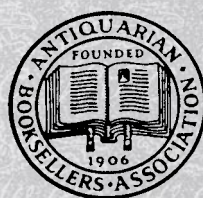

Notes to Catalogue 108

It has been 8 months since I did one of these NEW ACQUISITIONS catalogues and it is long overdue. Here is a good selection of uncommon Churchill material- Churchilliana, ephemera, signed photos, books about Churchill, and some postcards and cigarette cards. There are a few fine first editions, which had their own catalogue last year and should have another later this year.

The entries in this catalogue are arranged randomly, encouraging you to read through the whole thing.

For most of 2004, the exchange rate was nearly \$2.00 to the Pound Sterling. Couple that to that fact that dealers in England now think that anything remotely connected to Churchill is worth big money, and the result is that cheap ephemera is now just a memory. I made 9 trips to England last year specifically to buy Churchill books, but my acquisitions are well down from previous years.

4. Your satisfaction is important. Any item may be returned within 7 days for any or no reason.

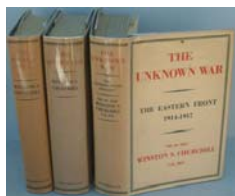

**1 The Epic of Malta**

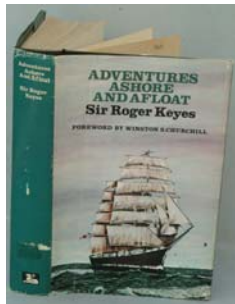
anon.. London, Odhams Press, nd (1943). Wartime book sold to raise funds for The Malta Relief Fund. Includes a full page photo facing a message from Churchill. Primarily a photo book, but well captioned. 7 x 10 inches, 128 pages, bound in blue cloth with decorative endpapers. This copy sunned on spine, contents clean, no dj. \$10.00

**6 The World Crisis, Macmillan 3 volumes complete**

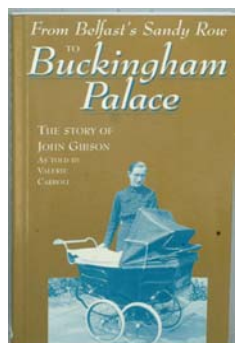
Churchill, Winston S.. Macmillan, London 1941-44. A set of the 3 volumes in dustwrapper of THE WORLD CRISIS as issued by Macmillan during the war. Consisting of THE WORLD CRISIS 1911-1918, THE AFTERMATH, and THE UNKNOWN WAR. When Thornton Butterworth went bankrupt, the Macmillan Co. bought the rights to publish their titles. By far the scarcest is THE UNKNOWN WAR, only 600 copies, so the book itself is scarce, and the dustwrapper incredibly so. The books are all near fine. DW's on the first two vols are VG+, dustwrapper on The Unknown War is especially clean and bright. DJ's have some minor edge wear at

**2 Unglazed white bust on plinth**

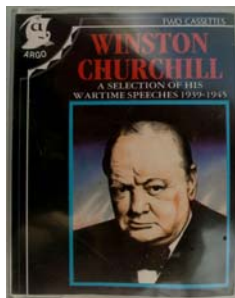
.. This is the standard bust with O.M. around neck, here in its unglazed format, about 6.75 inches tall, listed in Carmichael 10 years ago at \$150.00. An elegant attractive piece. This one has some faint brown stains on the plinth, so reduced price. \$35.00

**7 Adventures Ashore and Afloat**

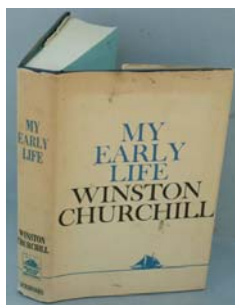
Keyes, Adm. Sir Roger. London, White Lion, 1973. This book covers the first twenty years of the author's long naval career. Churchill's two page forward has some interesting thoughts about the Pax Britannica at sea in the 19th Century when the Royal Navy ruled the seas. Navy (of course) cloth, 373 pages, index, photos. This 1973 reprint uses the same setting as the first, and retains the index and photos. Looks VG in dj, but underneath the book is ex-library with usual markings. \$24.00

**3 Belfast to Buckingham Palace**

Gibson, John. Dublin, Mercier Press, 1994. The Story of John Gibson, servant to the great. His career as a footman to Princess Elizabeth and valet to Churchill in 1948. Published in Ireland, first one I've seen. crisp unused copy. \$12.00

**8 Churchill's Wartime speeches on 2 cassettes**

Churchill, Winston S.. . Produced by Argo, in England, no date but c. 1980's. Total of 2.5 hours on 4 sides, lots of the best speeches 1939-45. In original clear plastic container, no signs of usage. \$10.00

**4 My Early Life**

Churchill, Winston S.. Scribners, NY, no date, (1970's). The Hudson River Edition, published in the 1970's, a series of reprints of older classics. Bound in blue cloth blocked silver. The dj is off white printed blue and black. A truly scarce reprint. Book is clean and crisp, seems unread edges even and white. Dustwrapper is slightly darkened on spine and along top of front cover, some wear at spine ends. \$40.00

**9 Wartime Calendar with colour portrait of Churchill.**

.. This calendar on light card stock features a smiling WSC in colour, red/white/blue ribbon at top for hanging. All 12 months for 1942 still on the pad, each with a different Churchill quote. Overall size 9.5 x 12 inches. facsimile signature under picture. Produce by Gehrke's Ltd. of Vancouver. Some mild creases. On ebay this would be listed as having a real signature and would go for a huge price. \$85.00

**5 Marlborough: His Life and Times**

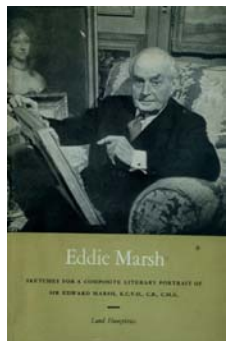
Churchill, Winston S.. Scribners. New York, 1968. This one volume abridged edition adds an introduction by the editor, Henry Steel Commager. A large book 6.5 x 9.5 inches of 983 pages, bound in smooth black hardcovers, stamped in gold. Includes 35 illustrations and 16 maps. This trade edition can be distinguished by a white panel on the rear of the dj with details of other Scribners titles. This copy is the first printing of the trade edition with A-3.68 code. A truly fine book and dustwrapper, collectable copy. Do not confuse with the flood of BOMC versions seen online. \$85.00

**10 Menton, Alpes Maritimes, print of painting by Churchill**

.. This large print was produced by the Medici Society in 1959, before the copyrights became locked up. This view is from the Reves villa, La Pausa. Image size 27 x 17.5 inches, on heavy paper 30 x 23. Never framed, wholly unfaded, stored for all those years. \$125.00

**11 The War Years, set of 10 educational tapes**

.. A set of 10 audio tapes for education use entitled THE WAR YEARS. Tape no. 5 is The War Situation, Prime Minister Churchill, May 19 1943. Each tape is on a reel and sealed in its own plastic box, the ten tapes come in the original box, and the teacher's guide is included. never opened or used. This came from the stock of an old radio shop. \$48.00

**12 Eddie Marsh, Sketches for a Composite Literary Portrait (B51)**

Hassall, Christopher & Denis Mathews (eds). London, Lund Humphries, 1953. Woods B51. A collection of short essays on Eddie Marsh, penned by friends and acquaintances upon his death. Foreword by Churchill. Contributors. include Graham Sutherland, Walter de la Mare, Robert Graves, Somerset Maugham, etc., etc. So it is collectible in a number of fields, and thus quite difficult to find. 52 pages, card covers with stuck on "dj". VG copy, slight edge wear, old owner inscription. \$100.00

**13 Churchill 1874-1965 El Ocaso de un Genio**

.. This comic book style biography was published in Mexico in 1965. It is 32 pages with colorful covers, which show some wear and staining. Scarce, not in Zoller. \$26.00

**14 Marlborough: His Life and Times, Vols III-IV in DJ's and slipcase**

Churchill, Winston S. . Scribners, NY, 1935, 1st American edition. Produced in 6 volumes rather than 4 as the British edition. Bound in emerald green cloth, gilt titles on spines. This is volumes III and IV only in the scarce first state dustwrappers which are printed in green on white stock. The pair came in a decorated slipcase which is also included. Books are fine, dj's are browned on spines and worn with losses. the slipcase is grubby and cracked. These are key items for anyone trying to complete a correct 1st state set in dustwrappers, rather than the later blue and gold dj's which are far more common. \$600.00

**15 Marlborough: His Life and Times, vols I-II in green/white DJ's**

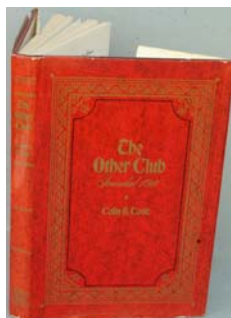
Churchill, Winston S. . Scribners, NY, 1933, 1st American edition. Produced in 6 volumes rather than 4 as the British edition. Scribners chose to split the first two volumes into two books each, but then the final two volumes were not so divided, making a total of six. The setting, illustrations, and maps are identical to the English 4 volume work. Bound in emerald green cloth, gilt titles on spines. Here are the first two volume in the scarce first state dustwrappers which are printed in green on white stock. Books are fine clean copies, owner inscriptions. Dustwrappers are darkened on spines, worn with losses at spine ends to 25 mm deep

**16 Wartime embossed brass plaque**

.. This embossed plaque features a spitfire, and has Churchill quote on The few at bottom. 12 x 9 inches, wartime. There is a small 1941 calendar pad stuck on the back. Corners slightly bent. \$40.00

**17 Churchill Crown coin in presentation case**

.. These special Churchill commemorative Crown (5 shillings) coins were minted in 1965. Here is a nice example in a fitted presentation case. These are \$50.00 without the case in New York. \$5.00

**18 The Other Club**

Coote, Coil R. . London, Sidgwick & Jackson, 1971. The Other Club was a men's dining club founded by WSC and F.E. Smith in 1911, that has included many important men in its rolls over the years. This history is full of anecdotes about them. A popular book, I can never get enough of these. VG+ in clipped lightly worn dj. \$25.00

**19 We shall not flag or fail... Pillow**

.. Churchill's stirring words of June 4th, 1940 are printed on cloth and made into a pillow, about 26 inches long, 9 ins wide. Printed dark brown on light brown with pale green accents. I've never seen anything like it. Must be wartime. \$38.00

**20 Small wedgwood blue jasper dish**

.. This blue jasper dish features a white relief portrait of Churchill. 4.5 inch diameter. Comes in original Wedgwood box. \$25.00

**21 Large Churchill biscuit tin**

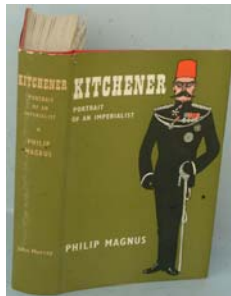
.. This colourful tin plate box is roughly 9 x 9 x 5 inches, colour portrait of Churchill, key events in Churchill's life on sides. VG a few small dings. \$25.00

**26 Menu from Sotheby's exhibition of Churchill Paintings**

.. Sotheby's held a special non-selling exhibition of Churchill paintings in January 1998. To open in, there was a complimentary banquet to those who had lent paintings or related ephemera, which is how I got invited. here is the menu folder for that exclusive dinner, featuring a painting on the front. \$2.00

**22 Wartime silver Churchill spoon**

.. This hallmarked sterling silver spoon is 4.6 inches in length. Handle has image of Churchill, says Rt Hon Winston Churchill Prime Minister. Wartime issue. Smith p. 79 shows a set of six. \$10.00

**27 Kitchener: Portrait of an Imperialist**

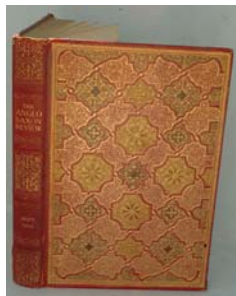
Magnus, Philip. London, John Murray, 1958. A 410 page biography of Lord Kitchener, index, photos, maps, drawings. An excellent book on its own, it also publishes a letter from Churchill so Woods assigns it D(b)113. This copy VG+ in bright dustwrapper, 2nd printing, from the library of Brig. H.A.D. Murray, with relevant cuttings laid down on the first few leaves. \$8.00

**23 NASH's magazine, 5 bound vols 1924-1928**

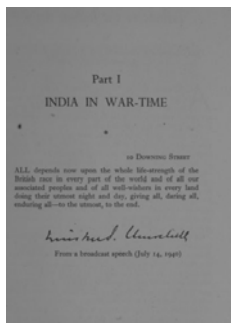
.. Here are a group of bound volumes (72-76) of Nash's Magazine, with a number of Churchill contributions. Woods numbers are: C92, C95, C98, C104, C107, C114, C113, C116, C118, C120 (both parts), C121, C122. In total 30 magazine complete with ads but no covers and 13 Churchill articles. Think what these would cost to buy individually, if you could find them (well, there is one place...). \$600.00

**28 Churchill delights crowd on Merseyside 1941 press photo**

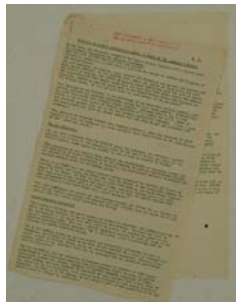
.. Here is an original wartime press photo, usual stamps on back it to 25 April 1941. The Prime Minister waving hat on walking stick to cheering crowd who collected when word went round that he was expected in the locality. Image size 8 x 6 inches. \$50.00

**24 The Anglo-Saxon Review, full run of 10**

.. THE ANGLO-SAXON REVIEW, published by Churchill's mother, Lady Randolph Churchill, from Jun 1899- Sept. 1901. Each issue was individually decorated in a highly elaborate pattern of gilt tooling on leather covers, based on 17th century designs. Unfortunately, the leather used was very thin and the spines are always cracked and faded. Winston has an article in the 4th issue. Like most copies of this work, the leather has dried and the tops of the hinges are cracked. 7.5 x 11.75 inches, some stains and other flaws. Prices online for a full set like this range up to \$7K. Here is a complete set, far from fine, but still better than many.

**29 Queen Mary's Book for India**

edited by unknown. London, George Harrap, 1943. This hardbound book of 103 pages contains a number of essays and articles praising India and her armed forces, with a number of well-known or important contributors. Although not mentioned in Woods, this book of interest as the first contribution is a message from the PM, printing his remarks about India from a 1940 speech. VG no dj. \$10.00

**25 Official release of Churchill's 19 May 43 speech to US Congress**

.. This official document is stamped "This document is the property of His Britannic Majesty's Government". It publishes extracts from Churchill's speech to Congress on 19th May, 1943. 3 sides on foolscap size paper, from a duplicating machine. This is a genuine period item from 1943. \$35.00

**30 1910 satirical postcard A Grand Members Concert**

.. This card is printed in red and black. It lists a selection of political leaders of the time and their performances at the Commons Concert. Mr. Winston Churchill will recite How Bill Adams won the Battle of Sidney Street. Also mentioned are Asquith, Lloyd George, Bonar Law, etc. Postally used postmarked 1914. \$25.00

**31 Postcard- Churchill at his desk 1933**

.. This card shows Churchill seated at a desk. There is a very good looking overprint of his signature. The verso has preprinted message about an article by Churchill to be published in The News of The World next Sunday. Postmarked January 1933. \$15.00

**32 Wartime postcard- Our Skipper**

.. Wartime sepia tone card, matte finish, produced by Photochrom Co. Ltd. An endearing memento of how Churchill was perceived by the wartime public. \$15.00

**33 Wartime postcard- We Will Finish the Job**

.. Wartime card by Raphael Tuck & Sons, Ltd. Features the familiar Cecil Beaton portrait of Churchill in no. 10. The quote ends with Churchill's reply to Mr. Roosevelt "Give us the tools, and we will finish the job." \$15.00

**34 Wartime postcard- Winston is Back**

.. This wartime card features the 1939 picture of Churchill on the steps of the Admiralty. This card has a preprinted message promoting a series of articles by Churchill to appear in the Sunday Dispatch. Postally used, postmarked in February 1940. \$20.00

**35 Cigarette card- Famous escapes 1926 double size**

.. One of the most colourful of Churchill cigarette cards. The picture shows Churchill climbing into a goods wagon to make escape via train. Printed on heavily laminated paper, these cards are always curled. Produced by Carreras Ltd. and distributed with their Turf brand of Cigarettes. This card is no. 1 of 25. This is the double size card. \$20.00

**36 Cigarette card- In the Public Eye by Godfrey Phillips 1935**

.. A full colour pre war card. The caption question reads "Has he ever served a Foreign Government?" This is card no. 53 of a set of 54. \$12.00

**37 Cigarette Card- Personalities of Today by Godfrey Phillips 1932**

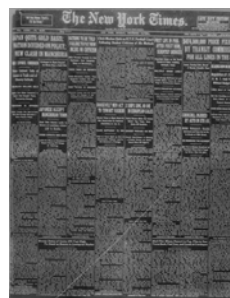
.. A colourful pre war card showing a caricature drawing of Churchill. This card no. 5 of a set of 25. \$3.00

**38 Cigarette card- Ogden 1900**

.. There are several variants of these Ogden's cards. This is the standard card with a blurb for Ogden's tab Cigarettes on the back. \$4.00

**39 Cigarette card- Notable MP's double size**

.. Features a colourful caricature of Churchill at the despatch box. This is card no. 2 of a series of 50 distributed by Carreras. This card is roughly twice the size of a normal cigarette card. \$20.00

**40 Churchill in the New York Times**

.. Here is a collection of 12 full size photostats (these are negative images as made before photocopiers) reporting events such as Churchill's car injury in 1931 and his wedding. size 14 x 20. The real deal with old NY Times stamps on back. \$20.00



41 Large photo of Allied leaders at Casablanca 1942

.. This photo measures 15.5 x 11.75 inches and is printed on thick quality paper. It shows Churchill, Monty, Ike, Alexander, Eden, Brooke, Tedder, Marshall and others. Unfortunately, there are some wormholes, but when a grey backing is in place they become hard to see. \$75.00



42 Solian ware Churchill plate

.. This wartime plate Solian Ware plate was made by Soho Pottery, Cobridge. Diameter is 9 inches, in an orange brown shade. A few tiny dots which I have not tried to remove. \$24.00



43 Royal Doulton Toby jug- large

.. This well known jug from Doulton came in three sizes- this is the largest at 8.5 inches. Makers mark on base in green. Fine. \$75.00



44 Cast metallic bust 15 cm

.. This nicely detailed bust is finished in a silver metallic tone and feels like some composite material. Artist is Elizabeth Sharp, produced by Marcus Replicas 1987. about 5.75 inches \$80.00



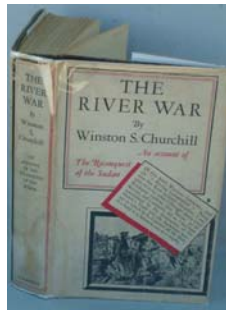
45 Polish mag with Churchill cartoon on cover 1947

.. In 1947 Poland was firmly in the grip of communism, so I expect that the theme of the cartoon is Churchill and the capitalists squeezing the life out of the downtrodden working class. 12 pages, 9 x 12 inches, printed on cheap newsprint, now browned and edge worn. \$24.00



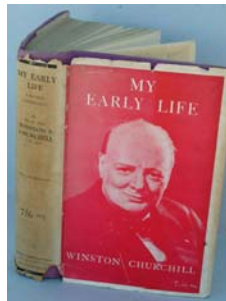
46 They Led us to Victory

. Bear Hudson Ltd., London, 1945. A souvenir booklet of portraits of British, American and Soviet leaders. 6 x 9 inches, 32 pages. Churchill is the first page portrait. Good wartime propaganda. \$15.00



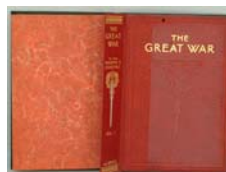
47 The River War (An Historical Account of the Reconquest of the Sudan)

Churchill, Winston S.. Scribner's, NY, 1933. Bound exactly like the English edition of 1933 other than Scribner's name on spine and title page, it appears this American edition was actually produced in England. Its scarcity means a premium over the equivalent English edition. Here is a nice copy in the scarce original dustwrapper. Book has one small white stain on front cover, traces of damp on lower portion of spine, edges even, no inscriptions. Dustwrapper is unclipped, faint stain on lower portion of spine, some edge wear with small losses at spine ends. \$375.00



48 My Early Life

Churchill, Winston S.. Thornton Butterworth, London, 1940. This impression had a unique dustwrapper with a red toned portrait photo on the cover, not used on any other edition or impression, see Langworth p. 137. Cloth clean and unfaded, gilt readable although none of these are bright. Foreedges have just a few scattered spots. Contents clean and tight. The scarce dustwrapper is darkened on the spine but has a bright magenta front panel. There are losses at spine ends, largest is a 16 x 20 mm triangle at base. The rear flap also has a large irregular 50 x 20 mm piece torn out, but this not visible externally. This dj is missing from most



49 Salesman's sample book for THE GREAT WAR

.. This was produced for salesman selling the 4 volume set of The Great War issued by The Home Library division of George Newnes. Elaborately produced with samples of text, endpapers, illustrations, even the decorative binding is bound in at the rear, thus retaining the rich original colours. A superb piece in fine condition. \$300.00

50 Double deck of Churchill playing cards

NA. NA. A special edition deck of playing cards. This is the annual deck issued by The Worshipful Company of Makers of Playing Cards for 1955, to commemorate Churchill's retirement as PM. These special decks are collectible in their own right. This was issued in blue or red. Shown in Hall p. 102.. Here is a double deck set, with blue and red decks, red deck has all 52, the blue still sealed so presumed complete. The pair in special two deck box which has some external wear. Same price as set I sold 4 years ago. \$175.00





51 Programme from Churchill Ball, 1951

. Uxbridge Division Conservative Association. . This 4 page programme printed blue on white card stock was from a fund raising ball for the 1951 General Election, which put Churchill and the Tories back in office. Nice Churchill cartoon on front cover, list of period music for this 1951 ball, lots of old ads. A copy of this went for \$61.00 on Ebay last year. \$10.00



56 Churchill Speech in Vital Speeches 15 March 1945

. . Vital Speeches of the Day was published bi-monthly in New York back in the 1940's. Each issue is about 32 pages, letter size. This issue includes 9 pages publishing Churchill's speech of 27 Feb 1945 on Decisions at Yalta. VG clean copy. \$25.00



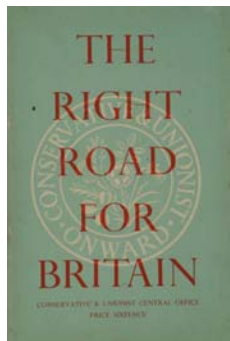
52 1910 Home Office certificate with Churchill signature

Churchill, Winston S. . . Upon the death of King Edward VII in 1910, it was Churchill's duty as Home Secretary to respond to the various condolences sent by public and private bodies. A black bordered form letter was used for this purpose, with the Royal Arms in black at the head. The name(s) were filled and a printed signature of Churchill appeared at the end. I have seen these offered on ebay as autograph signatures and sold for astounding prices. No such deception here. This letter sent to a Loyal Caledonian Lodge. Laid down on stiff card, size 8.5 x 13 inches. \$80.00



57 Proof copy of Clementine Churchill

Soames, Mary. Cassell, London, 1979. Here is an uncorrected proof in plain yellow card covers with a stick on label. It seems close to the final version as it has photos and an index. VG, slight signs of usage. \$20.00



53 The Right Road for Britain

anon. . Conservative Central Office, 1949. The Conservative Party's Statement of Policy, with a foreword by Winston Churchill. A 68 page pamphlet, 5.5 x 8.5 inches in pale blue card covers red titles over white emblem. Churchill was leader of the opposition and tired after 5 years of Socialist government. Scarce title. This copy tight and clean, slight toning of the paper covers at spine. \$40.00



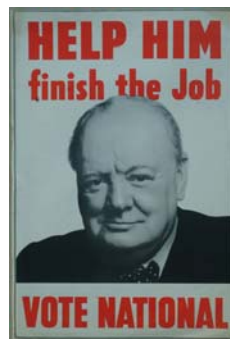
58 Photo of Churchill and the Queen at No. 10 in 1955

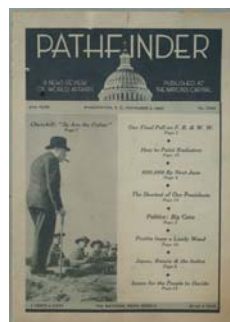

All 7 are complete with original colourful dustwrappers. The first four volumes are later printings, the last three are all firsts. The books are all VG but with some edge spotting and browning. Dustwrappers have some edge wear, mostly at spine ends. Think what this set would cost if they were all firsts. \$140.00

.. The 16 July 1982 issue has a cover photo of Churchill at the easel and inside is a brief review of the Churchill exhibition at the Wylma Wayne Gallery, with critical comments on the paintings. \$12.00

.. Still in the original envelope, here are details on the offering of reproductions of the famous Salisbury oil which hangs at Chartwell. These were hand painted in oil and cost \$1575 at the time. The packet includes a quality photograph of the original painting. \$20.00

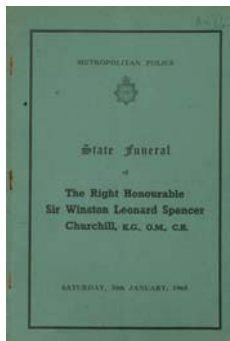
McKenna, Marthe. NY, McBride, 1933, 3rd imp. . A fascinating story of a very brave woman who worked behind the German lines as a spy. Churchill writes a 2 page foreword. 288 pages, photos. This 3rd printing is of interest as it has photo illustrated boards. This is a used copy with loose binding, wear at corners, paper browned at edges. No dj. \$24.00

**64 Photo of Churchill and Truman, signed by both**

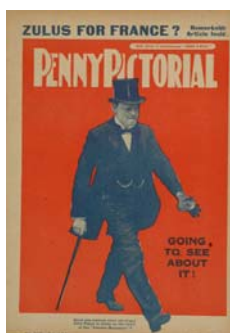
.. This is a black and white press photo with copyright info from International News Photos stamped on back. The photo measures 8.25 x 7 inches (23.4 x 17.8 cm). It shows The PM and The President in dinner suits sitting side by side in chairs with bookshelves behind them, Churchill speaking, Truman smiling. This was taken during Churchill's 1952 visit to the USA and is dated 1952 on the back. Signed on the image in black ink "Harry Truman" and "Winston S. Churchill". This is an important photo as it is signed by the two great leaders of the free world, when both were in office. \$6000.00

**66 Six Stories from Shakespeare**

Various authors. London, George Newnes, 1934, 1st edition. Contains an article by Churchill "Julius Caesar" from series of Shakespeare plays rewritten as short stories by eminent authors. 178 pages, bound in lime green cloth which is highly susceptible to fading. Boards and spine are unevenly sunned, making this copy unattractive. Some edge spotting, contents clean, no inscriptions. A good price for this uncommon title with a good Churchill contribution. \$38.00

**67 Metropolitan Police manual for Churchill Funeral**

.. Operations manual issued by The Metropolitan Police for Churchill's funeral. An incredibly detailed document that was obviously prepared well in advance as it was issued on 26th January. 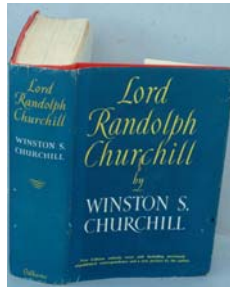
