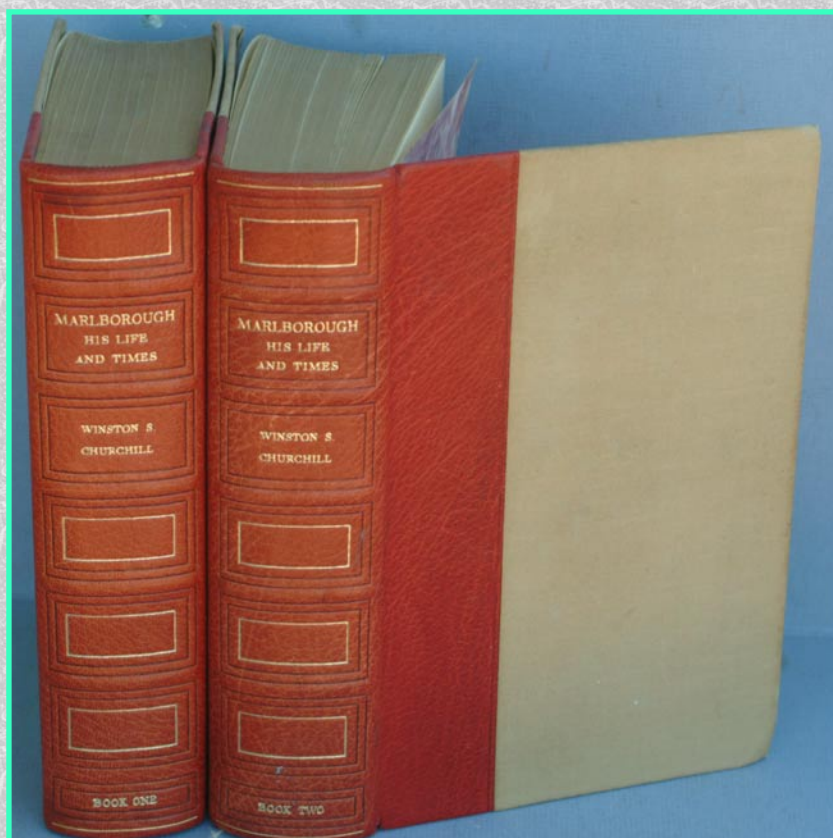


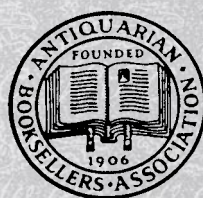

You may recognize some items from prior Holiday Catalogues. These are the items that sell well. Every set of the Folio Society edition of Marlborough I have listed has sold quickly. For the first time, I have 2 sets of this on hand. The emphasis is on items priced \$50.00-\$500.00, but there is also a handful of big ticket items, and a new section at the end of low price “stocking stuffers.”

A recommended technique is to circle desired items and then leave this catalogue out where Santa may be able to view it. Best Holiday wishes to you all.

Custom made cloth slipcases

I have produced these special cases to hold your collectible sets. Hand made of book cloth over board, custom blocked with special tooling including the Churchill Arms. My supplier has gone out of business, so when these sell out, there will be no more at these low prices.

THE RIVER WAR

This blue case holds the two volume sets from 1899-1900, features the same illustration of a gunboat as on the covers of the books. \$75.00

This blue case holds a six volume set of Thornton Butterworth first editions from 1923-31. \$85.00

This case in dark red cloth, holds a set of 4 English first editions. \$85.00



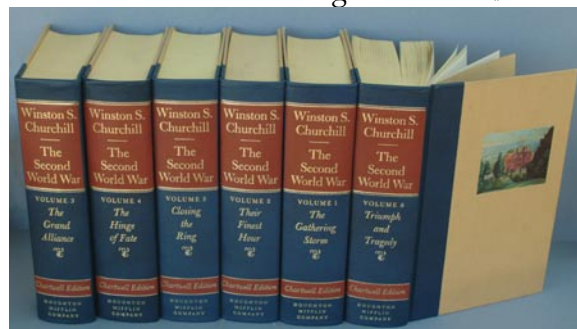
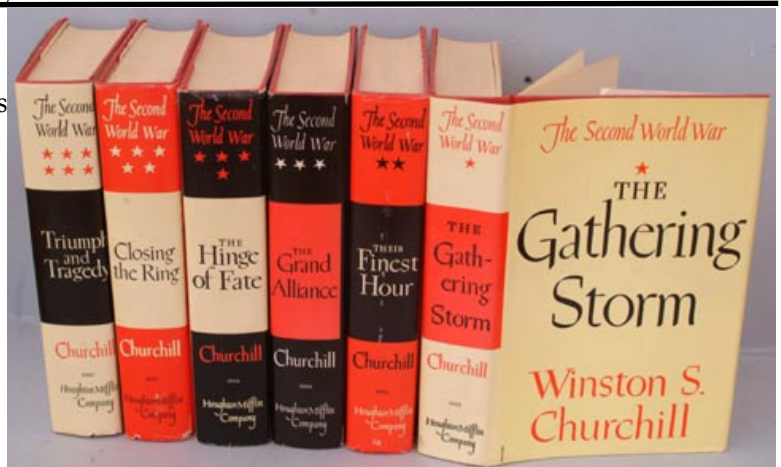
Special Selection of THE SECOND WORLD WAR

The first ten items in this catalogue are various attractive and collectible editions of Churchill's story of the Second World War. This is both important and highly readable. Not since Julius Caesar and his Gallic Wars has there been a case of a great leader in war also being an able writer. At the recent Millennium, this set was named the No. 1 non-fiction book of the Century by National Review. As Brookhiser summed it up: "The big story of the Century, told by its major hero".

There are many histories of the war, but most are written by historians in the third person. Churchill writes in the first person, in his own elegant style. Although the Nobel Prize for Literature was given for a lifetime of written work, it was this set which convinced the Nobel award committee to waive the normal rule against giving the literature prize to a politician.

THE SECOND WORLD WAR has long been the most popular of Churchill's work and is the title most requested as a gift. Here are some beautiful sets for your consideration.

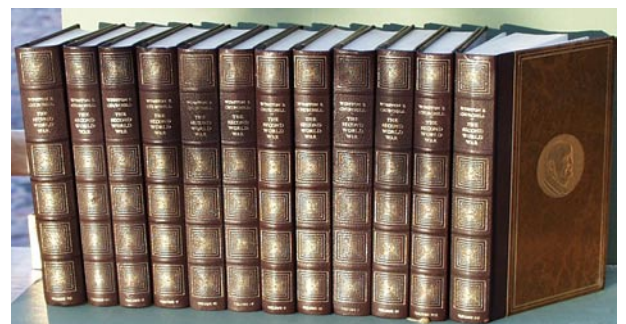
1 The Second World War, 6 volume set (ICS A123aa). Houghton Mifflin, Boston, 1948-53. This is the BOMC edition of Churchill's best seller. 6 volumes, 5.5 x 8.5 inches, bound in brick red cloth. These BOMC printings have unstained top edges and no headbands. These are later printings and lack dates on the title pages and have stock numbers on the dj spines. A clean bright set in superb dustwrappers. Books seem unused, dj's very bright. Although not firsts, this is a really pretty set and would make an excellent gift. \$95.00



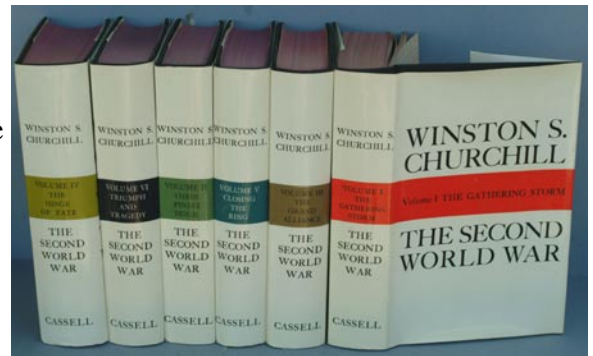
2 The Second World War, 6 volume set (ICS A123o). Houghton Mifflin, Boston, 1983. A deluxe new edition from the American publisher. Handsomely bound in navy blue leather spines, tan cloth sides, and a colour picture of Chartwell tipped onto the front cover. With a new foreword by Wm. L. Shires, and new multi-color map endpapers, this is certainly superior to the US 1sts. Most of these were sold via the BOMC, but a small trade edition of 200 was produced. This set is one of those and is identified

by yellow stained top edges and no dot on the rear. Fine bright unused set. \$150.00

3 The Second World War, 12 volume set (ICS A123m). Heron Books, London, nd (1974). An attractive set, split it into the original 12 "books" as Churchill wrote it. Bound in quarter brown leather over olive brown simulated kid-skin with an embossed gold bust on each cover, and gilt decorations on spines and cover. Each volume has decorative endpapers and a placemaker. Books are 5.5 x 8.75 inches. Unlike first editions, these are heavily illustrated with photos. A nice production, manufactured in Switzerland, ideal as a gift. Clean tight set, contents seem unused. \$160.00



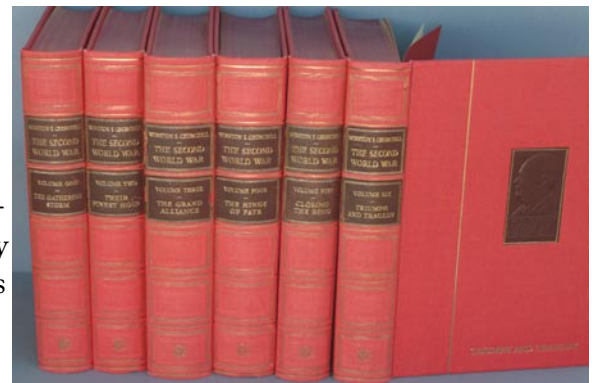
4 The Second World War, six volumes (ICS A123ba). Cassell, London, 1960's. These are later printings of the British edition. Books are the same black cloth as the first edition, but the dustwrappers are now white with a coloured horizontal band. Six volumes, maps some coloured or folding. here is a premium condition set. Books are crisp and unused, foredges white and even, top edges sunned to pink. Dustwrappers are unclipped, bright, even the red band on vol. I is unfaded. No losses. \$160.00



5 The Second World War, six volumes in slipcases (ICS A123r). London, The Folio Society. 2000. This newest edition of Churchill's classic may be the best ever. The Folio Society is famed for its high standards of book production, and this is a gem. Completely reset in Ehrhardt type using the final English text, printed on Grosvenor Bookwove paper, illustrated with b/w photos, maps in the text, etc. Includes a new introduction of 8 pages by Martin Gilbert. The substantial 7 x 9.5 inch volumes are bound in three quarter brown buckram, with photo printed cloth on the front cover, featuring a different photo on each volume. The six are supplied in two large slipcases, which also have a

photo on the "front". Crisp unused set in slipcases \$250.00

6 The Second World War (ICS A123e). Educational Book Co. Ltd., London, (1954). The Deluxe CHARTWELL edition was published after the completion of the six volume first English editions. It incorporates further revisions, so constitutes the definitive text. It is a deluxe edition in every sense. A larger book, nearly 7 x 10 inches, printed on quality paper, completely reset, numerous photos in each volumes, a two colour title page and colour frontis plate in each volume, and the whole beautifully bound. The standard binding was bright red canvas cloth, elaborately stamped in gold, with a brown leather embossed portrait on the front and a gilt stamped brown leather title panel on the spine. Other features include three colour maps, heavy coloured endpapers, top edges stained deep red, and two colour headbands. Here is a fine bright set. Bindings tight, spines unfaded, a few tiny scratches on spine labels.

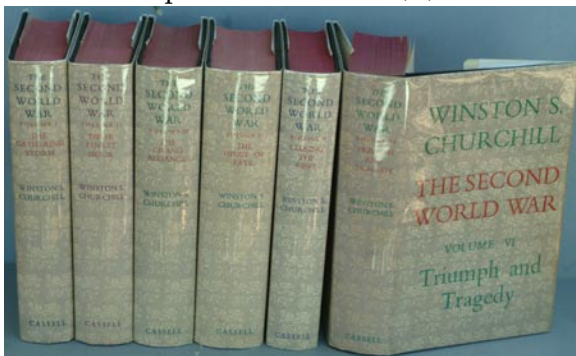
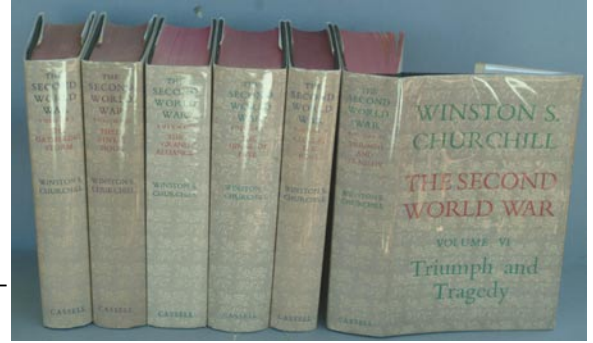

7 The Second World war (ICS A123q). Norwalk CT, Easton Press, 1989. An elaborate production in black pigskin with heavy gold tooled designs on the covers, raised bands and red panels on the spines, all edges gilt, placemarkers, silk moiré endpapers, archival paper, etc. Whilst not a first edition, the stunning appearance of these books makes an ideal gift for the Churchill enthusiast. Fine crisp unused set. No bookplates or owner markings \$475.00

8 The Second World War, six volumes (ICS A123ba). Cassell, London, 1948-54. The British first edition of Churchill's memoirs is superior to the American or Canadian editions as it includes Churchill's final revisions and has better folding two colour maps. Bound in black cloth, gilt titles on spines. Numerous maps and diagrams, but no photos. At first glance this appears to be flawless set in dustwrappers, but on closer inspection several minor flaws noted. The books are all crisp with bright gilt and clean foredges free of spots. Good colour on page tops but the first two are just a little weak here. Dustwrappers are all correct with bright spines and unfaded red subtitles, but slight wear at the spine ends of vols 1,2,5. Still a lovely set. \$500.00



9 The Second World War, six volumes (ICS A123ba). Cassell, London, 1948-54, 1st editions. The British first edition of Churchill's memoirs is superior to the American or Canadian editions as it includes Churchill's final revisions and has better folding two colour maps. Bound in black cloth, gilt titles on spines. Numerous maps and diagrams, but no photos. A lovely bright set of firsts in jackets. Books are crisp and unworn with deep unfaded red page tops, and no foxing on the foredges. Three of the volumes have a prior owner inscription. Dustwrappers are

all unclipped with bright spines, no fading of red subtitles, no losses, a small tear at base of spine on vol. V. \$600.00

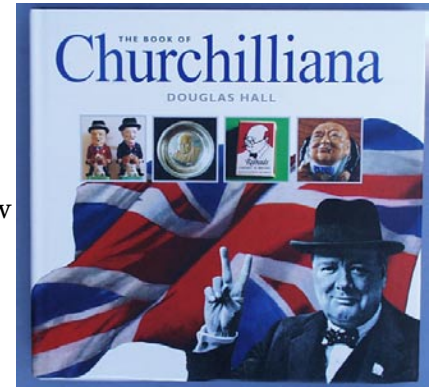
10 The Second World War (ICS A123e). Educational Book Co. Ltd., London, (1954). This optional leather binding of the Deluxe CHARTWELL edition was published after the completion of the six volume first English editions. It incorporates further revisions, so constitutes the definitive text. It is a deluxe edition in every sense. A larger book, nearly 7 x 10 inches, printed on quality paper, completely reset, numerous photos in each volumes, a two colour title page and colour frontis plate in each volume, and the whole beautifully bound. The extra cost leather binding is done in quarter light blue morocco over blue art vellum cloth with titling on spine in six gilt panels. Other features include three colour maps, heavy coloured endpapers, top edges stained blue, and two colour headbands. A fine clean set, very crisp and unused, top edges a good even blue shade, foredges clean even and free of spots. The light blue leather on the spines usually fades almost to white. These are still a good solid blue, with bright gilt decorations. \$750.00



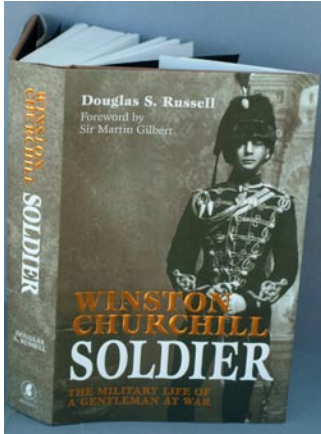
Author signed Books

11 The Book of Churchilliana, signed copy. By Douglas Hall, published 2002. This recently published book is without doubt the best guide to Churchilliana, written by long time collector Douglas Hall. It covers most of the main areas of Winston Churchill collectibles- plates, toby jugs, figures, ceramics, silver, bronze, medals, prints, and so. Profusely illustrated in colour, this a large book about 12 x 11 inches, 196 pages, weighs about 4 pounds. New copy in dustwrapper, signed by the author \$45.00

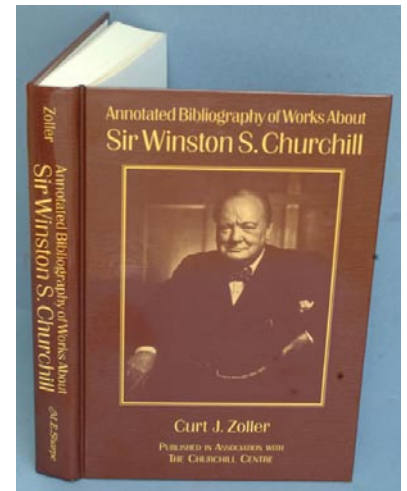

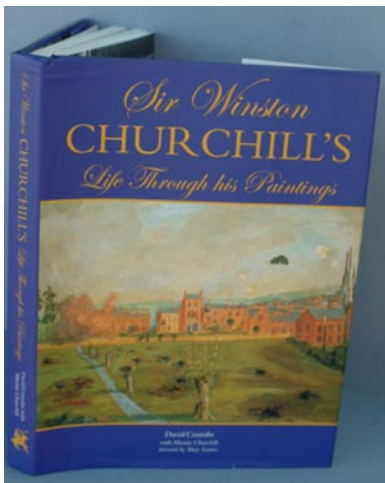


12 Winston Churchill Soldier (ICS Z). London, Brassey's, 2005. A thoroughly researched account of Churchill's military career, including both his early overseas exploits 1895-1900 and his time in the trenches during World War One. 480 pages, maps, appendices, detailed index. New copy signed by the author on title page. \$50.00

13 Annotated Bibliography of Works About Sir Winston S. Churchill, signed copy. By Curt Zoller, published 2004. The absolute best guide for collectors of books about Churchill. section A lists 684 titles about the great man, with details of publications and a brief description of the contents. We worked for years to ensure that this book is as complete as current knowledge could make it. The books are arranged chronologically, and there is also an extensive index by author. xvi + 409 pages, large size hardback over 7 x 10 inches, laminated pictorial covers. Fresh new copy, signed by the author at the same price as an unsigned copy from Amazon. \$75.00



14 Churchill: A Life by Martin Gilbert. London, Heinemann, 1991. A comprehensive single volume bio by the Official Biographer. This is a complete new text, not an abridgement of the 8 volume work. Highly recommended. 1066 pages, lots of photos, index. This copy signed on title page by author. Edges off white, dust-wrapper has wrinkles and slight edge wear. \$75.00

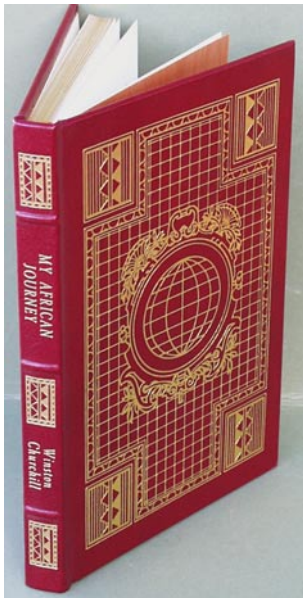
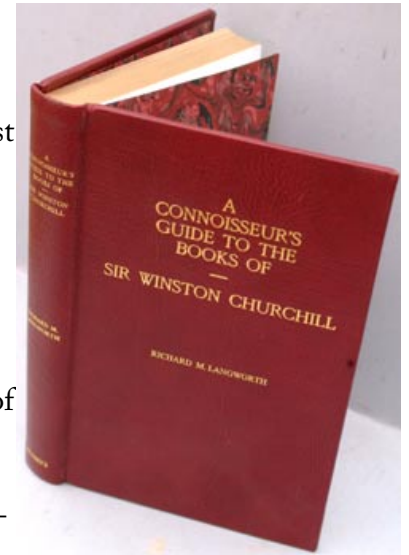


15 Sir Winston Churchill's Life Through his Paintings by David Coombs. London, Chaucer Press, 2003. Superb new book on Churchill's paintings, providing an update on the original 1967 catalogue, and with numerous new colour plates. Co-authored by Minnie Churchill. This is the real English first state, with the matte finish dustwrapper which was quickly replaced at the author's request by a glossy one. Signed on the half title by David Coombs. \$80.00

16 The Churchill War Papers vol. III The Ever-Widening War 1941 (Companion vol VI part 3) signed by author (ICS bio). London, Heinemann, 2000. This is the third volume of The war papers which are the companion document volumes to accompany the Official Biography. Although not so titled, this is effectively the third part of the Companion to volume VI. lxiv + 1821 pages, maps, detailed index. An important reference, now out of print. This British edition had a far smaller print run than the US edition from Norton. Here is a fresh new copy signed by Martin Gilbert on the title page at the launch of this book. Offered at the published price of £95.00 \$175.00

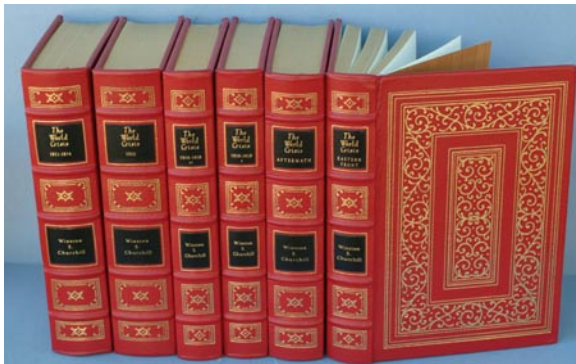

17 I suspect most recipients of this catalogue will already have a copy of Richard Langworth's book *A CONNOISSEUR'S GUIDE TO THE BOOKS OF SIR WINSTON CHURCHILL*. The first edition sold out quickly and a second revised edition is now available. there were 50 numbered copies of the first edition bound in leather. The last two copies, nos. 30 and 49, are still available. \$140.00



18 *My African Journey*. Norwalk CT, Easton Press, 1992. Most collectors are aware of the beautiful leather bound sets of Churchill's major works produced by the Easton Press. Many are unaware of the limited edition of *MY AFRICAN JOURNEY* published by The Easton Press in 1992. Sold only as part of a large and expensive collection of travel and exploration books, no single copies were made available to Churchill collectors. Bound in full leather elaborately blocked in gilt, size 6.25 x 9.5 inches, in dark red, all edges gilt, silk moiré endpapers. Now a modern rarity. Fine fresh unmarked copy \$200.00

19 *Marlborough: His Life and Times* (ICS A40d). Harrap, London, 1949. The two volume edition is unabridged and contains the full text of the original 4 volume work. Completely reset in smaller type on thinner paper, the books are 1052 and 1080 pages. All the maps and plans are retained, but the plates are not. The publishers offer a special binding in quarter orange leather with spines gilt in compartments over linen sides with decorative endpapers, top edges gilt. Here is an exceptionally clean bright set in this deluxe binding. \$425.00



20 *The World Crisis* (ICS A31af). Norwalk CT, Easton Press, 1991. A beautiful modern edition of six volumes in highly decorated full red leather. Uses the best text from Thornton Butterworth and adds the illustrations from the 1960's Scribners set, so this is the ultimate for reading. The binding in bright red pigskin features the usual gilt decorations from Easton, satin endpapers, placemarkers, all edges gilt, etc. A clean bright set with smooth even gilt edges, no signs of thumbing or usage. the original owner has affixed the Easton bookplate to the half title page in each volume. \$450.00

21 A History of the English-Speaking Peoples, 4 vols. FINE BINDING, These are English firsts 1956-58. Bound in a superb full crushed morocco binding signed Maurin. This is a top class binding with all the features you would expect- TEG, placemarkers, raised bands, marbled endpapers, etc. The dark red leather has some age toning that add to the charm of this set. \$2000.00



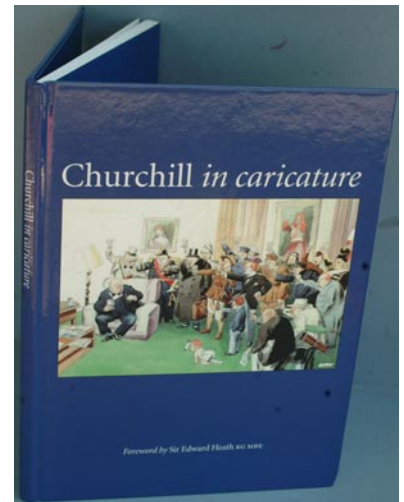
22 The World Crisis, fine bindings (ICS A31ab). Thornton Butterworth, London, 1923-1931, 1st editions. Here is a lovely set of first editions, bound some years ago by one of England's premier binders- Zaehnsdorf. This top



class work, half bound in crushed morocco, with red cloth sides, superb gilt seams between leather and cloth, spines have raised bands with gilt compartments, marbled endpapers, top edges gilt, original cloth bound in at rear, contents clean and unfoxed, this set clearly bound from nice copies back when they were easy to find. \$3200.00

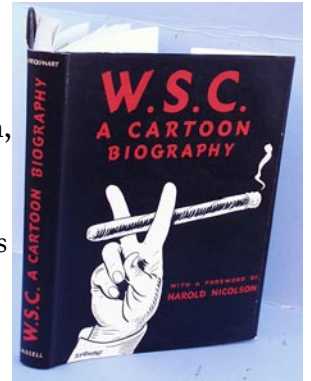
23 Churchill in Caricature. This charming book has been published by The Political Cartoon Gallery in London. It is A4 size, bound in laminated hard covers. There are 96 pages, printed on high quality paper. The front cover features the famous 1954 colour cartoon by David Low showing a horde of younger Churchills toasting the old man on his 80th birthday (contact me if you would like a copy of the original issue) The text is based on an exhibition at The Political Cartoon Gallery in London, which I can highly recommend to anyone visiting London. The book is not available in normal shops, but is being retailed by Sotheran's and Blackwells at £25.00 (about \$50.00) plus of course, shipping from England. \$35.00



24 Recipes from No. 10 by Georgina Landemare. London, Collins, 1958. This book is just what you would expect, a recipe book by an expert who worked for the Churchill's from the 1920's until 1954. Foreword by Lady Churchill. Although nothing to do with Winston, there is a huge demand for this obscure title, with some amazing prices seen on ebay. 191 pages, index. Bright copy in dustwrapper with some wear at spine ends. \$45.00

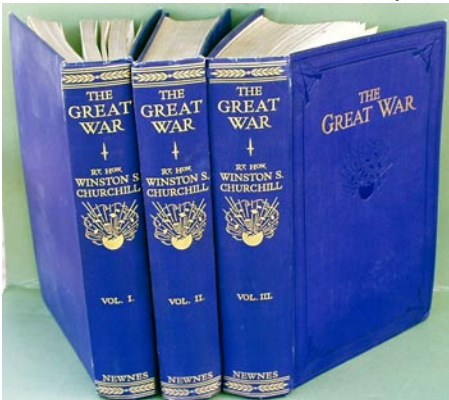
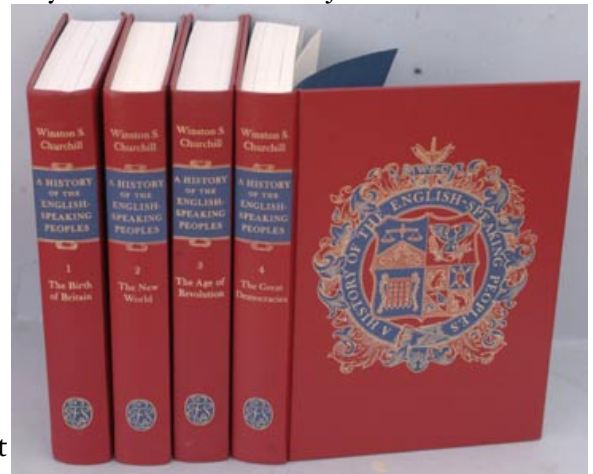
25 In Search of Churchill by Martin Gilbert. Harper Collins, London, 1994, 1st English edition. This book is an ABSOLUTE MUST for all Churchill enthusiasts. Unquestionably Gilbert's best book ever, highly readable, amusing. It tells the story of Gilbert's long involvement in tracking down the history of Winston Churchill, beginning with his time as research assistant for Randolph Churchill, about whom there are loads of wonderful tales. Please see the review in Finest Hour 84, which sums it up as "Pure Gold". 338 pages, index, unique photos. Clean tight copy in unclipped dustwrapper, the first state with price. \$55.00

26 W.S.C. A Cartoon Biography (ICS Z173). Cassell, London, 195. By far the best book on Churchill in cartoons. 242 pages of cartoons from 1900-1954, with index by source and artist. Highly Recommended. This is not a scarce book, so every Churchill library should have a copy. Here is an exceptionally bright copy. pages edges white & even, dustwrapper unclipped, unworn, unfaded. \$75.00



27 A fine bright set of the four post war reprints by Odhams press. The titles are: MY EARLY LIFE, THOUGHTS AND ADVENTURES, GREAT CONTEMPORARIES, STEP BY STEP. The books are all 1948 printings. All are fine crisp copies, with bright red stained paged edges and clean dustwrappers with bright unfaded spines. There is some faint mottling to the red covers, a common problem on this edition, and some wrinkles at the spine ends. The photo shows the books without the plastic jacket covers so you can see the nice djs. \$100.00

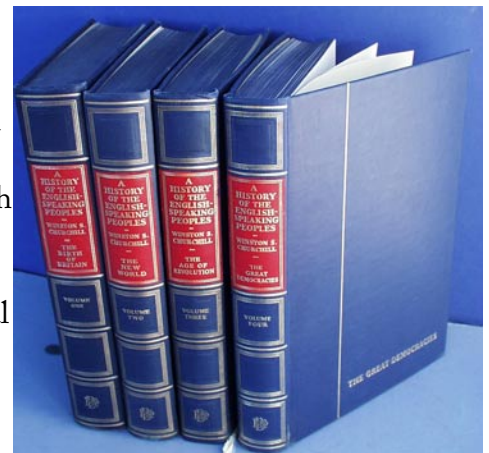

Includes numerous full colour photos selected for this edition. This set clearly unread. \$150.00



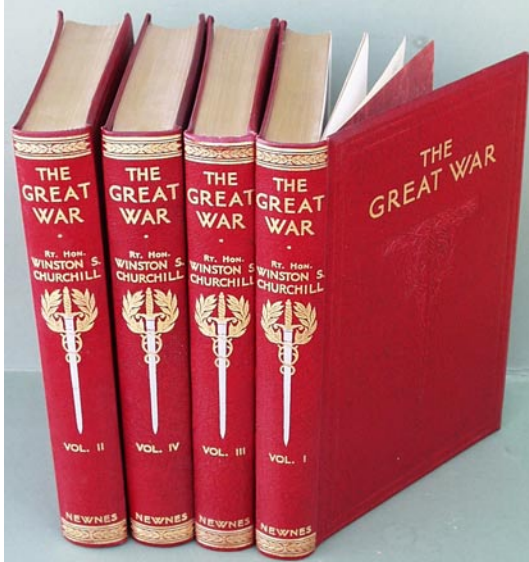
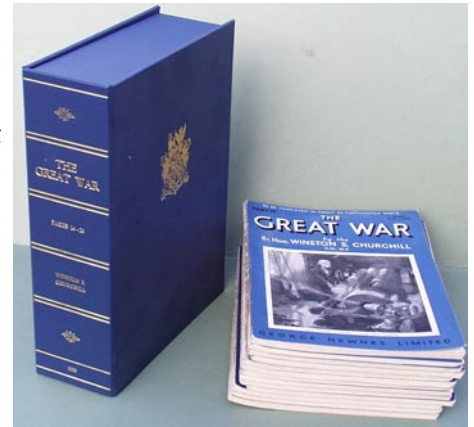
29 The Great War (ICS A31d). George Newnes, London (1933-34). The Great War is actually an abridged and heavily illustrated version of The World Crisis. This set bound in smooth cloth of royal blue with elaborate gilt and blind stamping featuring an exploding globe motif on the spines. Printed on quality coated paper, the 1668 pages in total make 3 very heavy volumes, weighing a total of over 12 pounds (5.5 kg). I have 3 sets, and plan to sell all at this low price, compared to \$300-500 elsewhere. First order gets the best set, all ar VG or

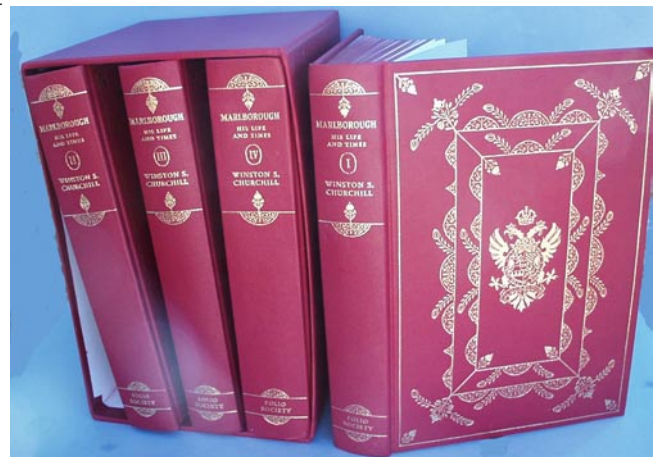
30 A History of the English-Speaking Peoples, 4 vols. (ICS A138d). Educational Book Co. Ltd., London, 1956-58. A deluxe edition published simultaneously with the first English edition. A lovely production- heavy navy buckram, spines decorated with gilt boxes and a red leather panel with gilt titles, top edges stained deep blue. Printed on high quality paper, two colour title pages, and fully illustrated, unlike the trade editions. This set ages well and has superb shelf appearance. This set bright and tight, several corners have a small bump. \$250.00



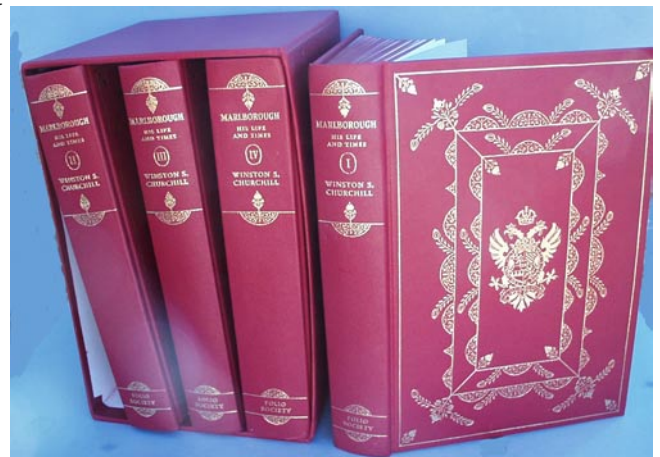
31 The Great War . George Newnes, London (1933-34). The Great War is actually an abridged and heavily illustrated version of The World Crisis, which was originally issued as 26 fortnightly parts or magazines. These are 7 x 10 inches with blue covers. The whole set forms a stack about 5 inches thick. Most were later bound up, so this original state is highly desirable. A very fine clean set, with spines intact. Presented in a matching pair of custom made cloth covered clamshell storage boxes with title on their "spines" and Churchill arms on the fronts. \$275.00



32 Here is an extra bright set of the best binding of THE GREAT WAR. The most elaborate binding was a 4 volumeset from 1934 of the remaining sheets done by The Home Library Book Co. (part of Newnes) The books are bound in a nicely grained red leatherette (sold as Red Cape Levant Moroquette) with gilt and silver decoration featuring a sword on the spines 1934 Printed on quality coated paper, the 1668 pages in total make 4 very heavy volumes, weighing a total of over 12 pounds. Ebay sales have ranged from \$400.00 to over \$900.00. These books draw your eyes from across the room. \$350.00



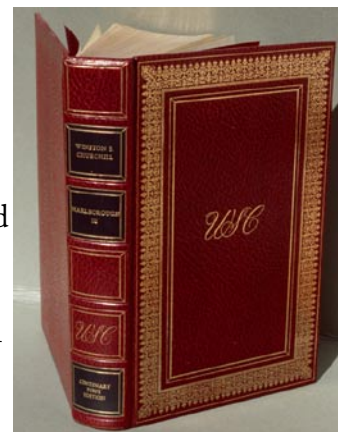
33 Marlborough: His Life and Times (ICS A40h). The Folio Society, London, 1991. The Folio Society edition of MARLBOROUGH, published 1990 in 4 volumes in the usual high standard of The Folio Society- heavy dark red buckram, blocked with a decorative design in gold, top edges stained, printed on high quality Hebrides laid paper, completed reset in Ehrardt typeface, new illustrations including colour frontis, all 4 in a large slipcase. Each vol 7 x 10 ins. This set when new sold for £180.00 from the Folio Society and is now out of print, and now elusive. Fine set in slipcase, bright unfaded unused. An excellent gift set. \$375.00



34 WINSTON S. CHURCHILL HIS COMPLETE SPEECHES 1897-1963 (in 8 volumes) (ICS A145a). Chelsea House/Bowker, NY, 1974. This definitive and near complete set of all Churchill's speeches comes in 8 massive volumes that total almost 9000 pages. Its index is unsurpassed for finding speeches. It is over 200 pages with 3 distinct sections. This reference work was published by Bowker and sold primarily to libraries when new, which explains its scarcity on the second-hand market. Everyone wants this to look up speeches, but it is rarely seen. Bound in red cloth with gilt titles on black spine panels. This set is a nice unmarked set with no major flaws, but is slightly dull in comparison to other sets I have sold. There is a small rub at the base of the spine of vol. IV. The foredges are very even and show no signs of use. \$1900.00



35. CENTENARY FIRST EDITIONS of THE MAJOR WORKS of Sir Winston S. Churchill (ICS AA2). Diners Club, London, 1974. The very scarce CENTENARY FIRST EDITIONS of THE MAJOR WORKS of Sir Winston S. Churchill as issued by Diners Club UK. A lavish production done in Switzerland in dark red pebble grained leather with black title panels on spines, with raised bands, large script initials WSC on spine and front board, extensive gold tooling on front and around insides of boards, all edges gilt, satin moiré endpapers, placemaker, tipped in frontis portrait. The full set as issued consists of 25 vols: The Second World War (6), The World Crisis (5), My Early Life (1), Marlborough (4), Lord Randolph Churchill (2), The War Speeches (3), HESP (4). Far scarcer than The Collected Works. When issued at £30 a book the set cost £750.00, a huge sum in 1974 money. A fine bright set of all 25 volumes, most volumes still have the tissue protectors on the satin moiré endpapers. \$2000.00

36 Silver Churchill Centenary Medals set of 24 in binder. This impressive set of medals was produced in 1974 by John Pinches Mint on behalf of the Churchill centenary Trust. Each medal depicts an event in Churchill's life with a small text explaining it. The medals have a brilliant proof-like finish and each is sealed in a plastic capsule, which are held 6 to a page in a 9 x 12 inch leatherette album. This set in solid Sterling silver with certificate. \$250.00



37 Churchill seated figure by Tom Clark. This highly detailed figure is made by Tom Clark, modern sculptor who has become highly collectible. This heavy 18 pound statue is made from crushed walnut shells. 9 x 11 x 13 inches high. Churchill holds a scroll which has readable text in tiny type of his speech of 29 May 1940. \$300.00

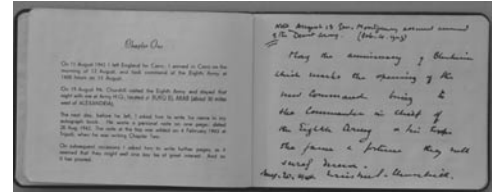

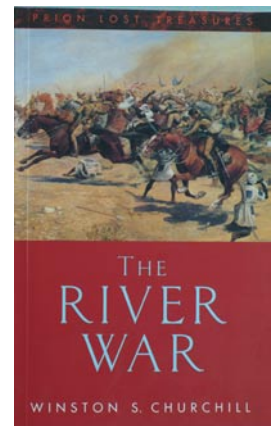
