Notes to Catalogue 126

This catalogue concentrates on Section B of the Woods (or Cohen) Bibliography. Most of these titles have forewords or introductions by Churchill, and a few are compilations of articles by various authors. This is a fascinating field for collecting as it takes lots of hunting and patience to track down all of the 83 items listed in Woods section B, or the 200 in Cohen. I can say that I have seen all 83 of them, so it is not impossible, but a number of them are truly rare. Rare and Scarce are words that are badly abused, particularly on internet auctions. I think of scarce as something that turns up once a year roughly, whilst rare is an item that only surfaces once every five years or so. Scarce and expensive are not the same. A signed set of Marlborough is not scarce, but it is expensive. Many of the scarcer items have not come onto the market in years. Most of the rarities I am offering are from the great collections formed in the 50s and 60s, names you may heard like Cloke, Pearson, Wybrow, Cahn, Hastings. I was fortunate to be in London in the 80s and 90s and was able to acquire some or all of these collections.

Those of you that believe that everything can be found online, often for 99 cents, should be advised that I have been watching all the online activity in books since 1994 and some of these titles have never appeared at any price

This is easily the best selection of these titles ever offered, and far exceeds the combined inventory of all the others dealing in Churchill books. Several of the great rarities are included: see catalogue nos. 9, 11, 17, 27, 31,165, 182, 205. There are also some scarce dustwrappers and a few inscribed copies. At the other end, there are many titles priced at \$20.00 or less
