

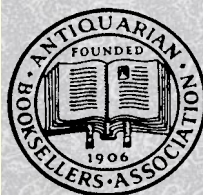

Notes to Catalogue 127

It has been nearly two years since I did one of these new acquisitions catalogues, so a good selection has built up. I have bought two interesting collections in the past year and also dug out two more boxes of treasure from the Wybrow Collection. One of the collections was acquired en bloc in 1965 and the new owner had a number of custom cases made to store some of the items, most made by one of the renowned binders of the day- Atmore Beach. There are numerous speech pamphlets that I have never offered before and even some not mentioned by Woods or Cohen.

Michael Wybrow began collecting seriously in the 1960s. He showed great initiative in writing to many of the Great and The Good who would have been likely attendees at ceremonies where Churchill received awards. He seemed to have been successful in obtaining original programmes and documents from many of these events giving Churchill freedoms and degrees. He even wrote to American state governments and managed to get some genuine documents from the files back in the days before photocopiers. In this catalogue I have offered as a lot his collection of non-original documents and the documents from US entities. The collection of original programmes from freedoms of cities will be offered at a future date.

Besides his numerous wartime statements, probably Churchill's best known and most significant speech was the famous Iron Curtain speech (The Sinews of Peace) delivered at Westminster College, Fulton, MO in 1946. There are a number of interesting items on this speech including an original programme, the press handout of the speech, and several later publications of the speech.

There are a few high end items herein, but the emphasis is low cost items- I count 69 items priced at \$50.00 or less, and well over half the items are \$100.00 or under. It is not economic to offer items at under \$5.00 in this illustrated catalogue, so I will be bring a huge selection of low priced ephemera to the Churchill Conference in San Francisco in September.

The Churchill market during the Recession

As we all know, most business activity is down, and the modern art market has taken a dive. It is unclear what is happening with Churchill collectables. I see a downturn in sales of high ticket items, but that is not the same as a drop in prices. For example, someone paid nearly \$12,000.00 for a signed LONDON TO LADYSMITH at a provincial auction in June.

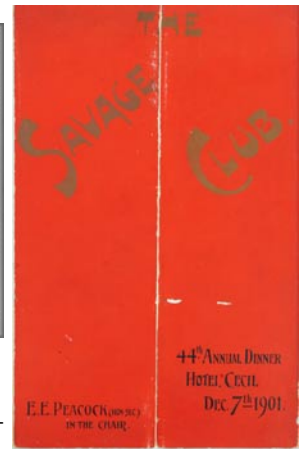
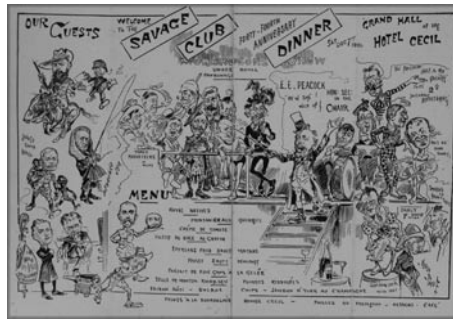

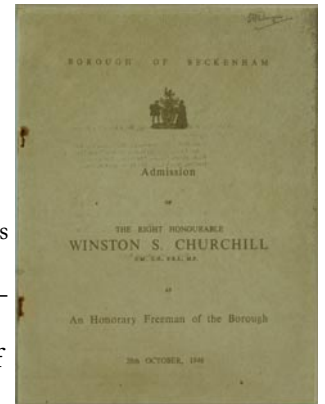
1. Portfolio of Churchill Club Dinners. This is a large flap case with a leather spine stamped indicating that it holds "Club Dinners- Speaker Winston S. Churchill" Instead are two scarce documents to start a collection. First is a seating plan for The Eighty Club Dinner for Churchill held on 29 dec. 1912. The Eighty Club was formed by Liberal Politicians to celebrate Gladstone's great victory in 1880. Folded size is 5 x 10 inches, but it opens to a 30 x 20 seating plan, and also includes a complete list of guests. At this date, Churchill was president of the club. Also included is the programme from the 1901 Savage Club dinner, an elaborate folding programme / menu for the 44th Annual Dinner of the savage Club, Dec 1901, with Churchill being one of two Guests of Honour. The Savage Club was an eminent literary club with many famous authors (G.A. Henty a big name) as members. 14 x 11 inches, folds to 3.5 x 11, bright red front, lots of caricatures. This is the real thing, 108 years old, has now split into two pieces.



2 The Michael Wybrow collection of Churchill Freedoms and similar presentations. Wybrow, the greatest of all Churchill collectors, made a huge effort to obtain copies of the programmes or other documents from ceremonies giving Churchill the freedom of a city or similar honor. He wrote to many of the great and the good of England who might have been invited, asking for copies for his collection.

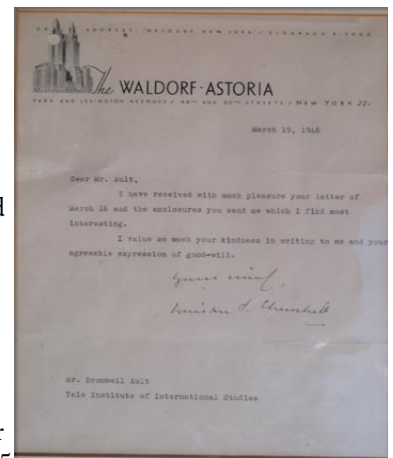


He also wrote to town and university offices requesting copies and sometimes receiving file copies. He ended up with a nice collection of both originals and copies. This lot is for his copies and letters of reply. Many of them are photostats which are negative images or primitive photocopies which have a brownish tint. I made the effort to duplicate this today, asking for clerks to dig out files from 60 years ago. There are freedoms of 16 cities including Eastbourne, Antwerp, Bath, Portsmouth, Strasbourg, and 3 US States. There are a further 20 presentations by universities and societies including The Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons, Universities at Liverpool, Bristol, Aberdeen, Miami, Oslo, and Edinburgh. Probably the most



interesting is the one from Aldershot, where the brown old copy pages are contained in a white cover on which someone has copied the original by hand in blue ink, down to the borough arms and the printers logo on the rear. I have another 30+ original which I will start listing in this catalogue, but not all at once so as not to overwhelm. This lot 36 various copies of documents or programmes. The buyer of this lot gets first refusal on the collection of original programmes. \$200.00

3. Large Karsh portrait with signed letter. Here is a large 11 x 14 inch print by Karsh, signed by the photographer in white in the lower corner. This is real print from the Karsh studio in Ottawa. It is mounted with a typed letter signed by Churchill. It is dated in 1946 and is on headed stationery from the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel in New York, where Churchill was staying after returning from the Fulton Speech 2 weeks earlier. The pair beautifully matted in a large 26.5



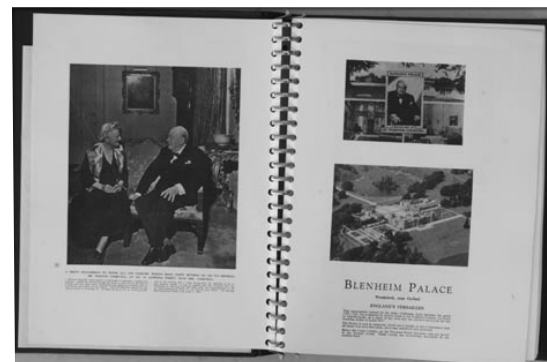
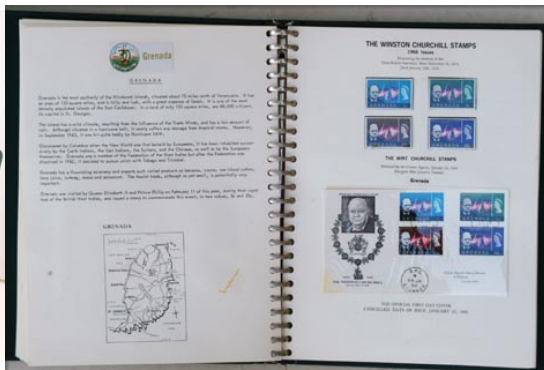
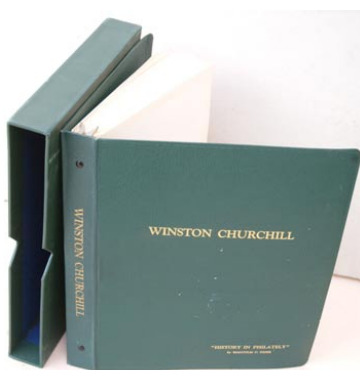
x 21 ins. frame. Churchill was feted by the City of New York at a Gala dinner at the same hotel 4 days earlier. The recipient of the letter was seated at table 96 and his copy of the dinner seating plan and program are included, as well as other correspondence with Churchill. The programme features the Karsh portrait so perhaps this inspired the display we see here. \$10,000.00

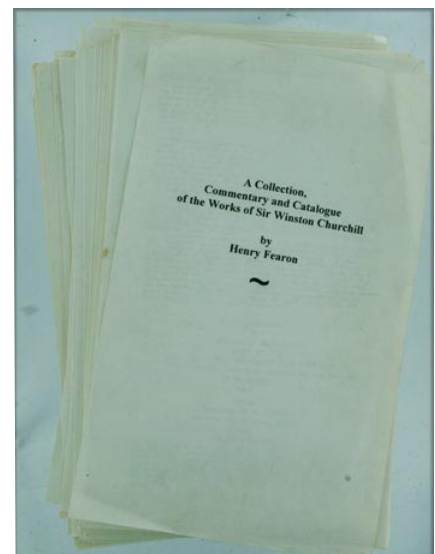
4. Lady Moyne's photo album of Middle East Cruise 1934 with the Churchills. The Churchills were invited to join Lord Moyne's party aboard his yacht for a tour of the Middle East and Mediterranean in 1934. Winston and Clemmy (sic) went along with a secretary- Mrs Pearman. The scrapbook style album contains over 250 photos- I see 18 with Winston, more with Clemmy. Here we see Churchill as a tourist later as host at Chartwell. A glance of a vanished world- one photo is captioned "Picnic in the Parthenon. In 1934 you simply walked up to these ancient relics and did as you pleased- no visitor center, etc. Sites in photos include Spain, Marseilles, Tunis, Syracuse, Rhodes, Athens, Baalbek, Damascus, Jericho, Petra, Cairo, and many more. size 11 x 14 inches. \$1500.00



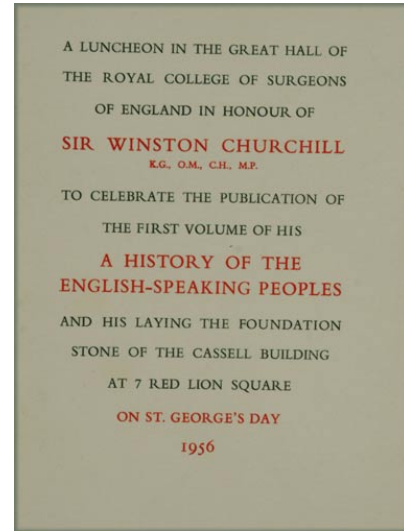
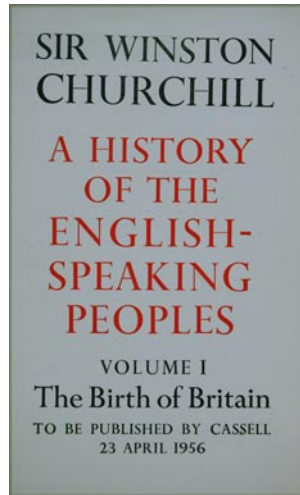
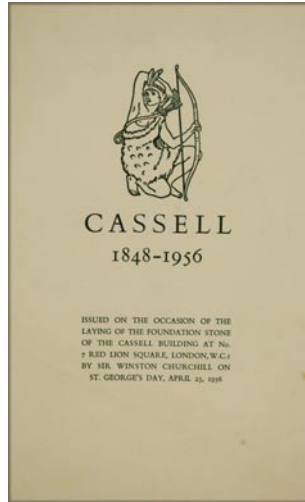
5. WINSTON CHURCHILL - History in Philately Album. This was a hand made group of 50 albums produced in 1966 by Macolm C. Dizer, his last such production as he was then in his 80s. It is based on the Churchill stamps and first day covers issued by the Crown Agents in 1966. Custom pages were produced nad printed on Churchill's history and the background of each issuing country. Fifty numbered albums were produced, 30 to friends and old clients sold in advance, only 20 were offered to the public. This is no. 41. It all comes in a green ring binder in a matching slipcase. This is the first one of these I have offered. \$300.00



6. The original manuscript of the Henry Fearon Bibliography of Churchill's works. Henry Fearon was the son of Percy Fearon, better known as the cartoonist Poy or Fieldfare. He assembled an extensive Churchill collection that was auctioned in 1995. This was lot 239, the original typescript in two colors of his book about Churchill's works- more of a book review and appreciation than a technical bibliography. I loaned this to Langworth who published some in *Finest Hour* years ago. Several hundred legal size pages. \$400.00



7. The Laying of Cassell's Foundation Stone. In April 1956, Cassell held a ceremony at which Winston Churchill laid the foundation stone for the new London Office. It was followed by a luncheon in the Great Hall of the Royal College of Surgeons at which Churchill spoke. The whole affair coincided with the launch of vol. I of A History of the English-Speaking Peoples. Here is a collection of ephemera from the events all housed in a custom flapcase stamped in gilt with a leather spine. Includes the menu, the table plan, several leaflets on HESP, and 3 press photos showing the union bricklayer mortaring the foundation stone and lining it up. total of 9 pieces. A unique collection. \$500.00



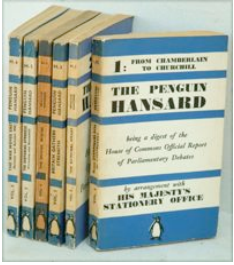
8. Large framed print of Churchill by Mortimer Menpes. This portrait of Churchill was originally published in 1901 in a book. This image is enlarged, so clearly some sort of copy of reproduction. The signature is, of course, printed. Mounted beneath the portrait is a quote from Churchill in facsimile. Professionally matted and framed. Overall size is a little over 22 x 32 ins. \$200.00

9. Intaglio Prints of Churchill by Curtis Hooper. This series of drawings was made in the 1970s with Sarah Churchill involved in the production and marketing. It is a long story and much of it can be found in *Finest Hour* #117. There are at least 20 different prints, and these large ones were done in numbered editions of 300 or 400. The size is about 22 x 34 inches, and each is signed by Sarah Churchill. I have at least 12 different prints in stock, and rather than picture them all here, I refer you the *Finest Hour* article, from which you can advise the desired prints. \$200.00 each, or 5 for \$750.00



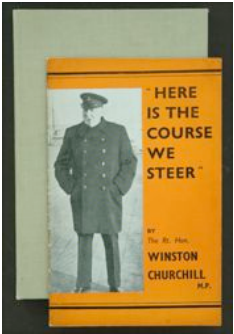

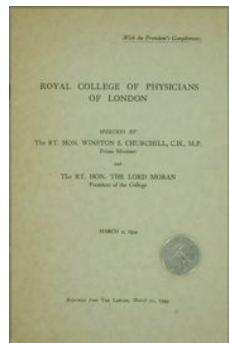

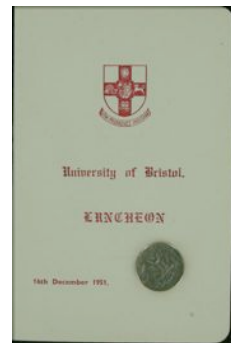

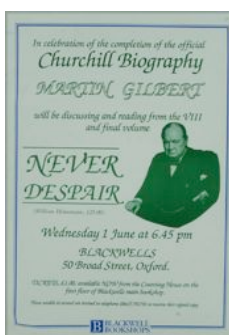

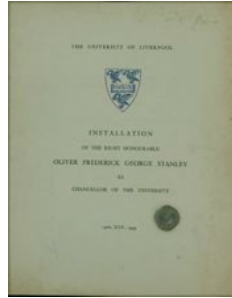

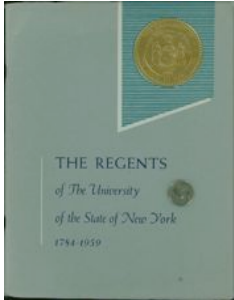

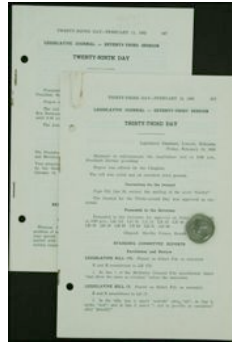

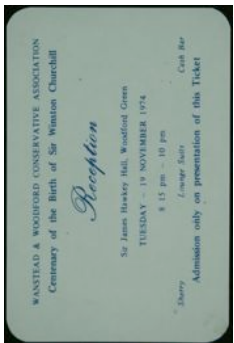

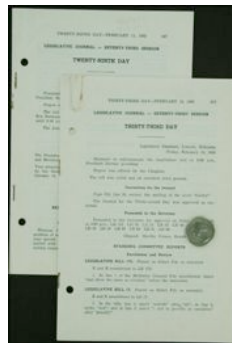

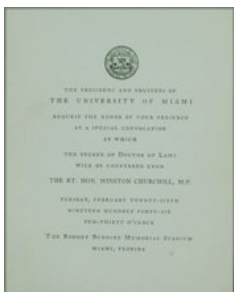

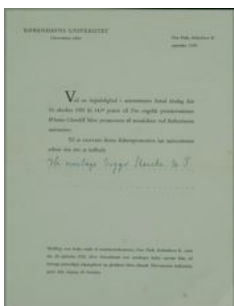

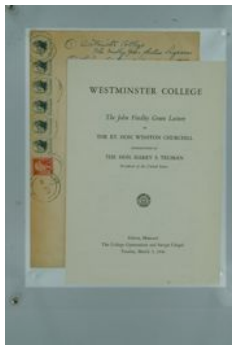
46 1933 Luncheon of the Elder Brothers of Trinity House at The Mansion House.

The menu opens out to reveal a large seating plan, which has Churchill, as an Elder Brother, seated at the head table. The front cover features a detailed gravure of the Egyptian Hall at the Mansion House. A lovely glimpse at life in pre-war England for those at the top. \$75.00

 . . This large cuttings album is 10.5 x 15 inches, 100 leaves of which 26 have been used. Cutings from 1926-1950s most are 1944-1962. The owner Capt. E.G. 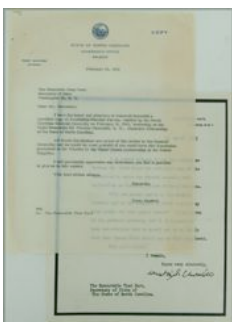

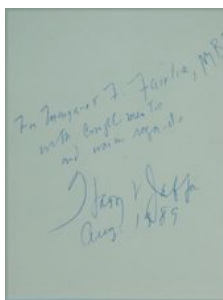

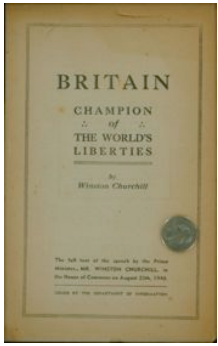

This copy has original typing noting it is a BC to Thad Eure (Sec State NC) The 2nd document is a copy stamped 1963 on the back of Churchill's reply to North Carolina. \$120.00

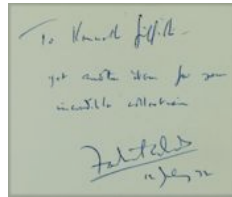
