Here is another of these very popular catalogues of unusual Churchill material. What you will NOT find here are the standard first editions, although there are a few unusual books by Churchill, and 2 sets of Collected Essays. There are some scarce speech pamphlets and a selection of books with Churchill contributions dug out from the Wybrow collection.


There is a selection of Churchill medals and silver, including several high end silver commemoratives from Garrard's and Mappin & Webb. With all the economic uncertainty, gold and silver are very popular now. But please do not expect to find anything priced below scrap value. In the past year silver has ranged from \$27.00-\$49.00 per ounce. (Troy ounces)

I have included some press photographs and postcards, but have so much of this material that dedicated catalogue is needed at some future date.

I have three of the highly sought stone commemoratives of stone from the bombed Houses of Parliament during the war. There are two ashtrays-one Churchill and one RAF; and then a paperweight.



. . Most of you are familiar with the Vanity Fair caricature prints of Churchill; one by SPY, the other by NIBS. What most do not realize is that these were originally issued bound, not as loose prints. Of course, over the years virtually all of these bound albums have been broken up to sell the prints individually. Here is the original Vanity Fair Album for July December 1900 (Vol LXIV). This includes the SPY print of Churchill. This is a big book, 10.5 inches x 15.5 inches, bound in dark green cloth. It contains a total of 25 colour prints of various Judges, men of the day, and so forth. This is the "album" format that contains only the prints and the text pages describing the characters in the prints. \$1000.00



The survival rate seems very low, so these are indeed scarce. This 64 page pamphlet publishes 10 of Churchill's speeches from 1941. 5 x 7 inches. Foxing on front page, small triangular censor's stamp. Lacks pictoriual outer wrap. \$50.00



27 Their Finest Hour, all 8 issues

Churchill, Winston S... These 80 page booklets of Churchill's speeches were published by a group of 3 newspapers in Western Canada in 1940. There were issues with a title page naming either Regina, Saskatoon, or Winnipeg. There was a combined issue naming all 3 papers. To further complicate matters, they were also issued in both orange and yellow card covers. So this makes a total of possible configurations. It took about 15 years to assemble this collection of all 8 issues. Some years ago, these sold for \$300.00 each in New Hampshire \$300.00



Nice copy, covers all there, edges even, top 13 mm of spine flaked off, paper browned as usual. Best price in years on this scarce title. \$400.00





Reprinted many times over the years, but firsts have now become uncommon, and scarce in nice condition. Book is clean with a deep rich spine colour and bright gilt. 
