

# Notes to Catalogue 146



This is likely one of the world top ten Churchill collections. Each collector has his own objectives. The aim here was every edition of all of Churchill's works with as many dustjackets as possible. Last month's catalogue featured the first editions and other premium selections. Here we have a selection of numerous "other" editions, some common, many scarce, and all reasonably priced. There are no \$500.00 books in this list. In fact, there are only seven items over \$200.00. The plan is to finish off the books in this collection with another catalogue later in November of Holiday gift books, such as the deluxe editions from Easton Press, Levenger, and the Folio Society.

The printed catalogue has pictures of limited detail. The download version of the catalogue allows the pics to be expanded for more detail. The online listings at wscbooks.com and www.abeboks.com will have larger photos and in many cases additional photos.

I try to describe the flaws in the books and jackets, and picture the spines of everything. These old pre-1945 books are rarely in perfect condition. If you require perfect, you should consider coming out to Tucson.




#### The River War
